Photos: Sixth Form College Grilling Archant Teacher The university sixth form will take part in a day of strike action today (Wednesday, November 20) urging the government to increase funding for their students and universities. Members of the National Education Union (NEU) will join the national campaign to work at the 6th Foster College in Wingretti Lane. Teachers are in dispute with the government rather than universities, which aim to raise awareness of the £700 million shortage in funding for education after the age of 16. NEU's John Delaney said NEU members at Harbing's 6th Foster College have a very clear message for the government, and their anger is growing. Every day they see the effects of shameful cuts to funding from 16-19 that have gone on much longer and much deeper than other school sectors. Serious investment is urgently needed to ensure that [sixth form universities] remain the 'jewel in the crown' of the education sector. NEU expects the party campaigning for the December 12 general election to consider increasing funding for sixth-form colleges. You might also want to see: they hope the funding will lead to job losses, increased class sizes and reversed cuts to training hours and curriculum delivery. Teachers also want to maintain fair wages and improve conditions and employment. Mr Delaney added that the public is not easily fooled by warm words and empty promises. They will take a closer look at the statement and carefully evaluate each party's educational commitments. I know that if you value education, you have to vote for it. Harving University said the Edley Green, Rainham, Quarres campus would not be affected by the strike and sixth-form colleges would remain open with students expected to attend as usual. Principal Paul Wakeling told the Recorder: Our chief executive, Gary MacDonald, I will continue with the new government, lobbying tirelessly to the government for improved funding. We are committed to using the increase in funding to continue to implement nationally negotiated pay awards and to improve facilities and resources for students. When exiting the station, take 256 buses to Noak Hill and get off at Harbing College (about a 20-minute bus ride from the station). This tube stop is in zone 6. Bus lines 256 and 294 stop near Adleigh Green 1. The closest main station to Ardleigh Green is Gidea Park on the TFL Rail/Elizabeth Line. Turn left as you exit the station through the ticket office entrance and the university is about a 15-minute walk from the station. Alternatively, you can take 294 buses outside the station to Edley Green Road (3 buses). This station is located in Zone 6. 2. The Emerson Park Overground branch line in Upminster and Romford is only a mile from the university. Turn right as you exit the station and the university is about a 15-minute walk from the station. Alternatively, there are 256 buses departing from opposite the station to Edley Green Road (3 buses). The station is zone 6 and the university encourages staff and students to bike to the university by providing cycle racks, showers and changing facilities. The campus is about 3 miles from the M25 intersection of 28 and 29. On the A127: The university campus that shuts down the A127 at Edley Green Road is half a mile from the university and the closest tube station is located on the left after the Upminster Bridge on the District line. Turn left as you exit the station and the university is about a 5-minute walk from the station. This tube stop Zone 6. Many buses are very close to the 6th harving form. These include 248, 370 and 373 (Upminster Bridge) Upminster Mainline stations within a mile of the university. The university encourages staff and students to bike to the university by providing cycle racks, showers and changing facilities. The A127 exit from exit 29 on the M25 to London. Take the left exit to Wingley Lane after 2.1 miles. After 1.6 miles the university is located on the left. The nearest metro station to Rainham is Elm Park on the District Line. As you exit the station, take bus 165 across the road to Rainham and drive on New Road (about 10-15 minutes by bus from the station). This tube stop is in zone 6. A number of buses stop close to the Rainham campus: 165, 287, 372 and 103. Rainham Mainline Station (C2C) is less than a mile from the university. The university encourages staff and students to bike to the university by providing cycle racks, showers and changing facilities. We are located on New Road, Rainham, RM13 8GP. On the A13: Take the ferry lane exit - along the direction for Ferry Lane North. Road bears left on Lansom Road at the rotorland take the first exit to the B1335. Take the first exit to New Road at the next rotory. The university campus is located on the left. Side.
